There are some really cool features to the new system that hopefully everyone has been using. The Stat Tracker feature is a lot of fun. If you haven't been on this part of the system, look at the menu at the login area where it indicates launch Stat Tracker. The Stat Tracker provides a continuous update of the individual statistics for your players and points as they are accumulated through the day and night. Also, it has a feature that allows you to see the total points being scored by each team and a continuous standings update. There is also a team stats portion that you can click on that allows you to see both the league stats for the day and for the season. Pretty cool stuff. I have also used the lineup analysis feature which I am sure particularly fascinates Ted. As best I can tell, it tries to project a recommended lineup based upon historical stats. It is somewhat flawed as to pitchers, but it is probably statistically useful for setting your lineup for hitters.

The Yahoo! system permits a continuous rotation of starting pitchers and Blongo will come out on the short end of this play with the staff as presently con- stituted.

Tribe	Very funny <i>Bullpen</i> writer.	A roster generally devoid of good talent and inexplicably with two empty roster spots.
Bronx Bombers	I really like the hitting squad led by Thome, Ramirez, Matsui and Shef- field. The Rios pickup should pay huge dividends. Chris Carpenter is a stud.
