Fall day, it was shaping up to be a Husker fan experience for the ages. Little did we know what lay ahead.



I'm pretty sure you all saw what happened from the comfort of your own homes, but after the Huskers scored their touchdown in the fourth quarter and then the defense held Sparty to three and out on their next possession, it looked like we had the game in the bag, as the small band of Husker faithful at the stadium started to chant *Go Big Red* for the first and only time in the game. After a bit, I already had chalked up the victory in my head, and was thinking ahead to next week and then thinking that we might actually get to a 4-and-2 record after beating Northwestern at home, when the bottom absolutely fell out. With our best field position of the game to start the drive, we suddenly got as conservative as the fringe right wing<sup>3</sup> of the HSL, and then had to punt the ball away, resulting in the horrifying runback after some unanticipated trickery from former Husker assistant coach Ross Els.

### **COMERICA REVISITED**




The Ernst Lads at Comerica Park



It was a glorious day for a baseball game, as the Royals outlasted the hometown Tigers by a score of 2-1, staving off a Detroit rally in the bottom of the 9th which produced the Tigers' only run and ended with the bases loaded. We also got to see Miggy record career hit No. 2984 after going 0-for-3 and hitting into a double play in his first three at-bats.



Sunday was probably my fifth or sixth visit to Comerica Park, and each time I visit I like it more and more. Not only do the Tigers continue to add great historical pennants and kiosks and other accourrements to the inside of the complex, but I hadn't before realized what a great view of the Detroit skyline one has from the third baseline seats, probably second only to the view from PNC Park. Downtown Detroit is thriving, as we saw several cranes erecting

new skyscrapers in the heart of downtown, and continuing to revive the urban core of this aged Motor City.
