A BUMS' RUSH

Brethren:

The story of Week 20 of the 2023 Hot Stove League campaign was the **Bums**, the hottest team of the second half of the season. Through last Sunday, the **Bums** had catapulted their way into 2nd place, and as of today, August 17, they now lead the pack over B.T. Squared (the monopolistic Baby Trumpetfish/Bridges Trust duo). Wow, didn't see that coming.

The **Bums** scored an eye-popping 645.0 points last week, the second highest weekly total this season behind the **Wahoos'** total of 651.2 points during Week 8.

The **Bums'** emergence breaks up the B.T. Squared stranglehold on the league which has been a source of dismay and nausea to all of the rest of us since Week 7 (ending May 14, 2023) and continuing on for just short of three months through Week 19 (ending August 6, 2023) when the **Wahoos** led the **Saints** by 23.2 points and the **Bums** were still 240.6 points back. Moreover, as recently as July 2, 2023, through Week 14, the **Bums** were a seemingly-insurmountable 656.8 points behind before their historic turnaround.

As we look backwards over the season, prior to this past week, the last team not named the *Saints* or the *Wahoos* to occupy one of the top two spots in the standings was the—wait for it—Redbirds, who on May 7, 2023, were in 2nd place and a mere 82.5 points behind the *Saints* before beginning their epic collapse into the cellar.

A little food for thought from these individual numbers:

- The **Bums** are now leading the pack even though they only have one pitcher, Logan Gilbert (446.0) among the top 25 pitchers. Contrast this with the last place **Redbirds**, who have both #9 Shohei Ohtani (466.0) and #16 Zach Eflin (440.0) in the top 25 list; and the 12th place Tigers who have both #2 Spencer Strider (538.0) and #25 Aaron Nola (398.0) among the top 25 pitchers.
- And I would be remiss if I didn't point out that the 11th place Senators have three pitchers in the top 25 with #10 Corbin Burnes (462.0), #18 Chris Bassitt (426.0) and #24 Max Scherzer (398.0). So I guess one has to say it's not really all about pitching.
- The Bums did have four pitchers on the Who's Hot Pitching list with #4 Tanner Bibee (62.0), #10 Logan Gilbert (45.0), #14 Sandy Alcantara (41.0) and #14 Michael Lorenzen (41.0), making headlines for the **Bums**. Remarkably, the **Bums** don't have a single hitter among the top 15 for the season, although they do have Bobby Witt Jr. at #16 with 435.8, Pete Alonso at #20 with 432.4 and Nathaniel Lowe at #21 with 426.6.
- Even though the **Skipjacks** have three hitters among the top 25 with #2 Shohei Ohtani at 618.3, #3 Freddie Freeman at 605.4 and #11 Adolis García with 465.1, they are

woefully out of contention and in 4th place at 741.2 points behind the league-leading Saints, as of last Sunday.

And what of the Wahoos, you ask? Even though they had the top hitter for the week, Matt Olson at 65.4 points, as well as #6 hitter Kerry Carpenter with 44.0 points, and #17 Aaron Judge at 35.0 points, for the week they only managed a measly 385.4 points, 11th best in the league for last week. So it's fair to say that the **Wahoos** have some pitching issues, it would seem.




