#### **WAHOOS WINNING**



#### R.I.P., OLD FRIEND



Jimmy Buffett 1946-2023

I was shocked and deeply saddened to wake up to the news last Saturday morning that Jimmy Buffett had passed away the evening prior at the age of 76. I knew that he had been ill last fall when he canceled the concert that we were planning on going to in San Diego in October, but I never heard an announcement that he was terminally ill, and he ultimately rescheduled some of his canceled concerts. In fact, just about a month ago I started looking around to try to find a concert on the calendar for our next family Buffett extravaganza.

I spent about half the day on Saturday wallowing in self-pity and the rest of the weekend drinking margaritas and reminiscing about all the good times had at Buffett concerts and listening to Buffett music.

My first memory of Jimmy Buffett was when I was in college and at a bar (I know that may come as a shock to some of you) in Okoboji for a fraternity rush party, and singing *Cheese-burger in Paradise* with a bunch of like-spirited Theta Xis and Xi little sisters, screaming like the bunch of drunken banshees that we were. But I didn't become a serious fan until my first year of law school when I lived with Brian Hennings and he had Jimmy Buffett albums frequently playing on the turntable<sup>1</sup>.

My first Jimmy Buffett concert, meaning my first step toward becoming a *Parrothead*, was at the Sandstone outdoor amphitheater near Kansas City on August 8, 1984, long before Buffett became a household name. It was a near religious experience for me.

I next saw Buffett at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha in August 1985 *after* an Omaha Royals baseball game, and then the following year I again saw him at Sandstone in June 1986. A

month later I saw him in Chicago at the Deer Creek amphitheater with Brian and Beth Hennings, and then again in 1990 when JT and Mouse and Mouse's pal Wiffy and I went to New Orleans for the Superbowl contest between the San Francisco 49ers and the Denver Broncos, and while there we learned that Buffett was playing and we made a gametime decision to attend the concert.

There have been several other delightful venues at which I have attended Buffett concerts, such as the Shoreline Amphitheatre in the Bay Area, visited in 1992; in a return to Kansas City in 1995; at the Sprint Center in Kansas City in 2011; and at the CenturyLink Center in Omaha in 2012 and 2016. But the three best Buffett experiences were all family junkets: At the MGM Grand in Las Vegas in 2006; at Target Field in Minneapolis in 2018; and the crème de la crème, our Labor Day weekend trip just two years ago (today) to see Jimmy at Red Rocks, Colorado.

I don't think I have ever before tried to rank my favorite Jimmy Buffett songs, but the top five would include *Come Monday, Son of a Son of a Sailor, It's My Job, He Went to Paris,* and my personal favorite, for which the Ernst acreage was nicknamed, *One Particular Harbour,* and it goes like this:




