## <u>A VISIT TO WICHITA</u> <u>AND RIVERFRONT STADIUM</u>

Yesterday I took a self-guided road trip to Wichita to catch up with my Kansan cousin Steve Ernst—whom I had not seen for some 33 years—and to take in a Wichita Wind Surge (AA Texas League) baseball game against the Tulsa Drillers in their sparkling new \$75 million dollar Riverfront Stadium. On a beautiful late spring night, with the temperature cooling down from about 90 at game time to the high 70s with a breeze after the sun went down, we saw the hometown Wind Surge put a cap on any hopes of a gusher on the part of the Drillers with a sixrun third inning outburst, featuring a mammoth grand slam blast by Yunior Severino, to blow the Wind Surge past the Tulsa Nine by a score of 7-2.

My take on Riverfront Stadium? It's about what you should expect from a \$75 million dollar investment, with lots of commercial development around the ballpark site under way or promised for the future. Here are a couple of pictures from the ballpark:











It was also good to see and catch up with my cousin Steve after half of my lifetime since our last encounter, and we made a pact to get together in '56 to celebrate my Centennial.


## **NOT HERE, NOR THERE:** IN PRAISE OF GREEN ACRES



This past Sabbath I started my day in just about the best way imaginable. No, not with Itchie at the Foot of the Cross, but downstairs on my elliptical watching early episodes of Hazel and Green Acres. That Shirley Booth, she was a real doozie, but then she had to be to keep the irascible Mr. B. (Baxter) on his toes.

And as for *Green Acres*, I'm not sure if I saw the first two episodes way back then (September 15 and September 22, 1965) when it first aired and they laid out the full story of how Oliver Wendell Douglas went from Manhattan bigshot lawyer to Hooterville farmer,

but there's a great line when the Douglases are in Sam Drucker's drugstore and meeting Mr. Drucker and Floyd Smoot and Fred and Arnold Ziffel for the first time. After learning that Oliver had purchased the unproductive Haney farm—replete with the dilapidated farmhouse for which nobody in his right mind would have paid good money—Sam Drucker asks Oliver if he had any previous experience in farming. After Oliver discounts his actual farming experience, wife Lisa reproves him for being too modest and



says, "Oliver had the biggest squash in all of Manhattan," which line was clearly not written for the youngsters such as myself at that time. Beautiful.



There is another great scene in which Eddie Albert introduces himself to Uncle Joe Carson and others at Sam Drucker's store by extending his right hand and saying, "Douglas." In response. Uncle Joe comments about how odd it was for him to have four different names (Douglas Oliver Wendell Douglas) as well as having the same first and last name. It is nearly impossible to quantify in words the amount of exasperation expressed by Mr. Douglas.

Now that I've figured out which network and which stations they are on, you can all count on more high-

lights from these two classic sitcoms from our youth.

#### NIXONLAND REVISITED

It wasn't until I was almost done with Nixonland that I realized that the television series called White House Plumbers was scripted from this very book. It was completely coincidental that I read this book and practically simultaneously watched the three episodes of the WHP





series. The multiple occurrences of dirty trickery by Nixon's henchmen are now underscored and reinforced in my mind from the combination of the two.



To provide some historical perspective, Nixon was serving his first term in office and getting crucified for the United States' continued involvement in the Vietnam War. He became obsessed with the onerous task of getting reelected in the 1972 presidential election. The aptlynamed Committee for the Reelection of the President (acronym CREEP) was created to explore and implement "the dark arts" a/k/a "dirty tricks" for the benefit of Nixon's reelection campaign, primarily to spy on opponents and foment damage and chaos in the opposing camps. In addition to former CIA agent E. Howard Hunt (who allegedly had been in charge of the Bay of Pigs debacle in Cuba) and attorney G. Gordon Liddy, other members of the "Ratf\*\*\*ers" (as they called themselves) included POTUS 46 loyalist, friend and pardonee Roger Stone<sup>1</sup> and now so-called respected Republican strategist Karl Rove. Nixonland details how POTUS 37 himself pushed on his chief oval office lieutenants, H.R. Haldeman and John Ehrlichman, to suggest specific opponent attacks and dirty tricks. I found it fascinating that during the Democratic nomination preseason, Nixon wanted his henchmen to focus their efforts on Hubert Humphrey and George Wallace (now running as a Democrat and no longer an Independent) and others, but to keep their mitts off of George McGovern of South Dakota, because Nixon viewed him as the least formidable opponent to face in a general election.

If you have any interest in that kind of thing, I encourage you to watch the White House Plumbers three-part series. Woody Harrelson is terrific in the role of E. Howard Hunt, and the dude that plays G. Gordon Liddy is also excellent. The series focuses primarily on the efforts of Hunt and Liddy to obtain dirt on Daniel Ellsberg, the primary leaker of *The Pentagon Papers* to

the press, which were an embarrassment to anyone who had a hand in the Vietnam debacle, dating back to Truman, Eisenhower and JFK but potentially spilling over to Nixon. As chronicled in the book and the series, the White House Plumbers were comedically inept, and it was their final failed attempt and the Nixon administration's attempted coverup of same which led to our nation's only presidential resignation.
